Not sure how to set up your An Tir dot org polling account? Here's a brief tutorial

This was written using a Windows 7 PC with a Chrome browser. It works the same on a Galaxy Android tablet, using the Chrome browser, with slight visual changes on a Samsung Android phone. See the pictures at the end of the tutorial. The screens look the same on an iMac using Safari.

If you already have an Office or Event Steward account, and would like to make a Populace account for the polling, you will need to create a new user name, and use an email address that isn't already in the An Tir Account system. For example, if this is how you log into your Officer or Event Steward account,

John Doe John Doe@email.com


you would need to change your registration credentials for the system to accept your Populace account registration: Populace account registration credentials might then look like this:

Doe John <u>Doe John@email.com</u>

You will also need your SCA membership number when you set up your populace account.

Setting up the Account


Open your browser to a new tab and enter antir.org in the url navigation field. You should see this:



Because the An Tir website has a lovely scrolling gallery, I can't get screen captures of the next step.

- 1) Put your mouse cursor on MEMBERS, the last option on the title bar, to the far right as you view the screen.
- 2) This will give you a drop-down menu with two options: LOGIN and REGISTER.
- 3) Select (click on) REGISTER


This should take you to a page that looks like this:



This is the form you will fill out in order to create an account.


The first field box is called TYPE OF ACCESS.

- 1) Select (click on) the POPULACE option.
- 2) Please notice there is a very faint "*" after the words TYPE OF ACCESS. This means that it's a required field. If there's no "*", you don't have to fill out that field.
- 3) EXCEPT, this time, you need to put your Zip Code into the unstarred Zip Code field. Here's a picture:

Once you've finished filling out the necessary fields (and the zip code), and reassuring CAPTCHA that you are a human, you need to submit your account application:



Select (click on) the big yellow REGISTER button.

Cell Phone view:


Here's what it looks like on a Samsung Android phone, using a mobile Chrome browser. This is what it looks like when you arrive at antir.org on the mobile phone. That is to say, it MOSTLY looks like this. The gallery messes with screen captures on the phone, too. What is **important to see** is the yellow box on the viewer's right, with the three white, horizontal lines.

Select (click on) the **yellow square** with the white lines. You'll get a drop down menu that looks like the picture below.

These are the same options you see on the title bar menus (pics above).

Select (click on) MEMBERS. This will get you the drop down menu that will let you register (and log in for the polling).

Select Register, and fill out the form, remembering that the Zip Code is needed.

Please remember, this is how you sign up to participate in the Baronial Polling process.

How the polling process will work is explained in the Facebook post quoted below:

"Greetings to the Barony of Adiantum, the time draws near for the commencement of your Baronial Selection polling.

Your polling is slated to begin December 1st and close at midnight on December 12th.

To prepare- please make sure that you have set up an account with antir.org, this will take a day or two as all accounts have to be approved. If you do not already have a login- please set one up now, to allow yourself the maximum amount of time to complete your polling.

On the day that the polling opens, you will see an announcement on the main An Tir page, with a link to follow.

This announcement will also be shared on the appropriate Facebook groups as needed. The polling will be accessible through this link: https://antir.org/online-baronial-polling/

You will need to go to the above link, log into your profile on the An Tir Page, and then you may begin the polling near the bottom of that page. It will start by asking you to please put in your Name, Membership number and zip code. The page will auto fill in your Branch based on our zip code database.

Once those items are input, you will be directed to 1 of 2 pages:

If you live within the borders of the Polling Barony (as defined by your zip code)

you will be taken to a page with details about the first couple, please fill in the support statement (multiple choice) and follow up with any thoughts or opinions you wish the crown to hear when making their decision. You will then continue through a new page for each candidate couple until you submit all at the end. You may come back and change/update your entries until the polling form closes on the above-mentioned date.

If you do not live within the Polling Barony (as defined by your zip code)

you will be taken to a page that is an email template form to their Majesties' email address. Please feel free to register your thoughts/opinions in this form about Any and ALL candidates. Once submitted, this email will be sent directly to their Majesties for consideration.

*Please note- each registered member in the household can only submit 1 version of the form through the website for each Antir.org login. (You will need to register each member with their own email address).

In addition to the pageantry of the Coronation Court and the Kingdom level meetings for peers and officers, there are lots of activities for everyone. They include:

Visit the Burgess Collection of Medieval and Renaissance manuscripts at the University of Oregon Knight Library on Friday afternoon, 2:30 – 4 pm. Incidental Music and Performances, in the main lobby on Friday, from 3 pm when the event opens through the evening, and perhaps on Saturday morning. You can volunteer to sing or play or perform a spoken piece, either as incidental music or a specific performance. Arts & Sciences Display, in the main lobby and the mezzanine level. Anyone can request space to display the things they have made. We hope to arrange mini geek sessions with the folks displaying their craft.

Italian Renaissance Ball with dancing to live music and a performance of Scala's 1611 scenario, "The Betrothed" by the Commedia dell 'Arte troupe, i'Falsari, on Saturday evening.

Dulcia Domestica: Home sweets

Original Text:

Dulcia domestica: palmulas vel dactilos except semine, nuce vel nucleis vel piper tritum infercies. Sales foris contingis, frigis in melle cocto, et inferes.

Translation:

Home sweets are made thus: dates are stuffed, after seeds are removed, with a nut or with nuts and pepper, sprinkled with salt and candied in honey and served.

Redaction:

- Ingredients:
- Dates
- Pine nuts
- Pepper
- Coarse ground salt
- Honey

Mix pepper with pine nuts to taste. Stone dates and fill with nut and pepper mixture. Roll stuffed dates in salt. Warm honey in pan until honey has become more fluid. Place dates in pan. Cook, turning the dates occasionally, until the skin of dates begins to split (about 5-10 minutes). Serve drizzled with remaining cooked honey from the pan.
