WORDS from Their Excellencies Brynjarr and Isis – Hello! We've made it into the Tourney Season. Feedback is that it was a great event.

Ontario Oregon has group wishing to become a canton and then a Shire. Principality has asked if Adiantum would support and assist as they grow. They will need a Seneschal. Exchequer, and 1 additional officer such as one of the marshals or A&S officer. Those officers would report to Principality directly, not through Baronial officers. Brynjarr and Isis will make trips to support them. Others expressed interest in caravaning with them for that purpose. [Fingall volunteered to help them with finding a name.]

We will be attending War and July Coronation. Their royal Highnesses are looking for guards; a few volunteered, more could. July Coronation is in Salem.

WORDS from the Seneschal – I will not be going to War, but anyone here who would like to do archery this weekend, I've posted times available.

OLD BUSINESS

Egil's Tourney 47, May 26-29, Hrodnavar Hakonson, **Steward.** Advisor Emeritus: Yseult of Broceliande The final event report is appended to the end of these minutes. Good debrief meeting with lots of good ideas for next year – please read the report.

Adiantum Beach Revel, Oct. 21, 2023, 10-5, Cyeth and William: at Washburn State Park, a social gathering on the beach. Could have 20x20' list fields (bare minimum). Let's wait and see how large the space is, maybe usedthe packed sand area. Brynjarr and Isis will investigate. Or we could do the heavy championship at Midwinter Feast.

NEW BUSINESS

Open officer positions: Youth Combat, Youth & Family Activities, Cut & Thrust, Rapier, Social Media, Lists is seeking a successor. Our A&S officer is seeking an extension – extended unanimously. Bohemond is willing to be rapier marshal – couldn't attend tonight but is willing to do the job. Accepted as new Rapier officer unanimously.

Baronial Customary. Has been posted, only minor questions about details of wording. Q - Would it be better to have Birthday Bash closer to town so accessible to newcomers? Response – we have had lots of newcomers at B'day Bash despite the rural location. And we can't have missile weapons in the city limits.

Q – Should we have an event that is public to attract new people? Could B'day Bash be a demo in this sense? Response – We don't have to have the archery championship at that event. But maybe we should make the fall event larger to accommodate more championships? Brynjarr - We're still getting our feet underneath us after the pandemic. We're not running at optimal levels now, may not be by the time we step down.

Any other questions about the actual draft Customary? Passes unanimously. The Seneschal will post the newly revised Customary.

Egil's Tourney bids for next year. Need initial bids submitted by midnight Friday, July 7 to the Financial Committee so we can vote at the July Council (Seneschal, Exchequer, Baron & Baroness).

June Investiture 2024 bid is needed. Murchadh will post in the next 24 hours what the deadline needs to be based on the Principality Laws.

OFFICER REPORTS

Arts & Sciences, Aila'ntha of William's Keep: A&S was able to provide over 40 classes, geek sessions, and demos at Egil's this year. This represents over 228 pupils or attendees. Due to difficulty reading signatures I'm unable to provide an accurate headcount for actual number of people served. Both attendees and presenters gave positive reports, with many listing receiving requests for repeats in 2024. Contests were better attended than last year. While Pam worked tirelessly to promote them I believe we can do better still in 2024 with additional promotion through A&S during this next year.

A&S met June 11th and met again on June 25th for maille repair by John Wayland. These are in person meetings. I plan to return to hybrid meetings in July.

Warrant expires 6/29/23, renewed for a second extension. My current SCA membership expires on June 30th 2024.

Chamberlain, Yseult of Broceliande: Warrant Expires: 7/25/2024. Membership expires 10/31/2023. Pavilions and other Baronial items were put away Tuesday after Egil's Tourney. We will have a great sorting out after the A/W War and Country Faire to identify what pavilion stakes and ropes are Baronial and what belongs to Alan. I made a new valence for the Thrown Weapons pavilion and painted two center poles for the new pavilion donated by Sir Alail. The Egil's Tourney debrief generated a list of signs and other things that need to be made for next Egil's Tourney; I will be working on those after the War. Work on labeling, color coding, and packaging the various pavilions continues. Isis has repaired five of our wrought iron eric stakes.

Chatelaine, Johanna Trewpeny: Warrant Expires: 11/20/2023 (2nd Ext.) Several follow up emails and survey contacts made. Egils debrief report made. Newcomer at Archery who had been to Egils appreciated the event and found helpful info in the Chatelaine tent.

July 21-23 - Demo at the Lane County Fair. Please contact Dame Johanna for more info. Let's try to have enough participation to create 'shifts' rather than marathon days.

Chronicler, Yseult of Broceliande: Warrant Expires: 11/22/2023. Membership expires 10/31/2023. There was no Council in May, but I did take minutes for the Egil's Tourney Debrief on June 19, which are attached to the end of these minutes. I published the second 2023 BiCranial Bear on June 20 and have sent a copy to the Web Minister for publication on our web site.

Exchequer, Asgerdr Audsdottirr: Warrant Expires: 8/23/23 (willing to extend 1 yr) Bank balance TODAY: \$13,444.46

Egils 23: Event stewards have data they requested. Waiting on PayPal payment from Kingdom, to be \$6,051.81 (net of fee). Total income for the event is \$4,745.07. I believe all expenses have been paid. I have some suggestions for gate for 2024; they're in my event report. I will be writing up gate procedures for small and large events. Will run those by other gate leads for comment, No outstanding issues.

Gold Key, Helen Louise Gaskyn: Warrant Expires: 11/22/2023

Gold key is all clean and put away after Egil's Tourney We helped 48 adults and 10 children with clothing items. Gold Key had some inkle belts, leather bags and jewelry and populace badges to sell. Received \$200 from fundraising sales, given to Marian Alter at Egils. Thank you Marian, Donald and Steve for items to sell, to Mearwynn, for running key so I could teach 8 classes, and to Tori, Elizabeth, Miles and Heidi for helping in general. Special thank you to Miles Berry for breaking down and packing the Gold Key after Egils. We received 3 bags of garb donations. Hours worked for Egil's Tourney by GK: setup 8hrs, during event 40hrs, breakdown 6hrs, cleaning and storing 10hrs

Adiantum was invited to provide Gold Key at the An Tir/West War. I plan on making a few more xxxl tunics, but it's all ready to go.

Herald, Finngall McKetterick: Warrant Expires: 12/28/2024

Egils: Happy with the number of volunteers I had for various herald needs. Good help with Town Cry, especially morning wake-up. Good coverage for field heraldry for list field tournaments. No consult, but had inquiries that Emmeline from Terra Pomeria helped with. Spend 3-5 hours a month depending on the number of consulting inquiries.

Lists, Acacia: Warrant Expires: 8/23/2023 Not present, nothing submitted

Marshals

Archery, Alan Bowyer: Warrant Expired: 2/26/24 (1st Ext.)

At Egil's Tourney, the largest shortage was manpower. We were always short-handed, and I had to close the archery range when there were not enough officials to run the range safely. Ideally, in a competition there should be three: marshal, scorekeeper, and greeter. Open range only needs a single marshal and greeter. I will try new ideas to keep enough people on the ground.

As far as equipment, we have enough gear. But when people needed loaner gear, I was often the only person who could put bows and arrows into their hands. I would have to stop watching the range to find a bow or arrows for the new people. We need to have greeters trained in issuing and retrieving gear.

Time management. We need to be able to start setting up the range earlier in the day, even if there are not enough hands available. We waited until the parks had mowed the range before setup, and lost valuable time. We need to be more self-starting.

2 hours a week submitting reports, 4 hours a week taking care of/making equipment.

Armored Combat, Wulfric Marinus: Warrant Expires: 12/28/2024

This month there was one injury reported. The injury did not need hospitalization or treatment but affected the individual for a few days after the injury occurred. Having just been informed of the injury I am in the process of reporting it to the Summits Marshal.

Egil's had a significant presence of fighting in Adiantum. Due to Egil's and posting a small "ad" for each practice there has been a large turnout at Heavy Fighter Practice this month. Practices have averaged 5 fighters. Each practice of the month has had a new person interested in knowing more about heavy fighting. Two new fighters have utilized the baronial armor and have been authorized to fight heavy. They both are planning to attend An Tir West War.

Cut & Thrust: office is vacant.

Rapier, Bohemond Reynard de Gervais (Jon Reynolds) 246827 Elected unanimously as the new Rapier Officer.

Hauk submitted the following report about Egil's Tourney:

At Egil Skallagrimmson Memorial Tournament, May 26, 2023 through May 29 2023, we had the following total attendees on the Rapier Field:

- Cut and Thrust Tourney: 7 Entrants, 2 Marshals. Winner Jerric.
- All Entrants and Marshals were adults

Notes: No injuries occurred during any of the Rapier/Steel tournaments or melee events.

Thrown Weapons, Eoghan Ua Cléirigh: Warrant Expires: 11/28/2024

Practices have been held Monday evenings, 4:00 – 7:00pm, and most Saturdays 12:00 – 16:00, at the Dexter Range, and are coordinated with Archery practices as weather allows. Practices are also adjusted so as not to conflict with Events.

Scores have been reported and no injuries or accidents have occurred.

Our Barony currently has the top 3 throwers in the Kingdom, all in the expert Division.

The Baronial Trailer is located in Dexter. All hitch and door locks are on the trailer and Murchadh has custody of the keys.

Thrown Weapons is set up both in the barn and outside adjacent to the archery range in Dexter.

Egil's was a resounding success. TW had a total of 42 individual participants. The only major change I would have for next year would be having scorekeepers during tournaments. Total volunteer hours for the weekend were 24 hours to set up and tear down, and 1 marshal for every hour the range is open, approx. 7 hours per day Saturday and Sunday and maybe 4 hours on Friday. Totaling 42 hours. Adding score keepers for tournaments would bring it up to 50 hours. Summits Hunter was won by Bjorki Shieldsbane. The Thrown Weapons Prize Tourny was won by Nathanael Lekarev. All Egil's scores have been submitted.

Normal practices have continued. Monthly hours are maybe 2 hours a month outside of practices.

Youth Armored Combat: office is vacant

Scribe. Victoria De Kente: Warrant Expires: 10/25/2023

Not much to report. Got the charters done that were needed for Egil's Tourney. Will be out of time for 2-3 weeks in July.

Seneschal, Murchadh Monaidh Chroaibhe: Warrant Expires: 9/26/2024.

Egils was a success, and we're building data to adjust to future budgets and event growth. The last critical piece of transition is the Bank Signature Card, is complete! Sometimes bank mergers are a blessing, and this is one of those times.

Quarterly Reports are once again approaching, due by July 15th.

We continue to do work under our Volunteer Agreement on Lynx Hollow Park. Opening up more space to camping is good, but I'd like to see what we can do with the State Parks Manager to improve accessibility both for pedestrian traffic and parking.

For the first 6 months of this job I put in more hours on this than for my modern job. It's down to 10-12 hours a week. now


Web Minister, Katherine of the Lakes: Warrant Expires: 7/25/2024


them after council so that they will be ready for next year. The Three Mountains web minister will help me with organizing the officer web page.

Biffies Increased 40% over last year

Park Utilities Reimbursement

In the past OPRD reimbursed 50% of Water/Trash/Biffy cost This year reimbursement was only 37.5% (this cost us \$1221 more than expected)

U-Haul cost more than budgeted.

The budget was based on a trailer. In fact we need a truck. U-Haul did not bill us for an extra day, so we saved ~\$40.

I donated 6 gallons gasoline (~\$24)

Cost savings:

Giving out old towels and t-shirts saved \$500 on site tokens
Prizes cost ~\$450 less than budgeted
Recycling brought in \$235
Pyks' donation of stairway supplies got us a \$358 rebate from OPRD
Printing was free (saved \$250)

Participation/Activities

Three Pillars

participation was disappointing, only 2 people went for overall

We put a lot of effort and expense into prizes, but with overlap of people entering more than one contest, we only had 14 individuals entering 6 contests. Is it worth it?? Competing for the 3P Championship means that the competitor doesn't have time for anything

else. It doesn't seem to appeal to many people. Suggest we consider dropping Three Pillars.

Heavy weapons fighting

32 fighters suited up. The high-value prize does not seem to be a big draw as it was in the past. I suggest that the SCA has changed. Nice stuff is readily available, and a major prize is not sufficient incentive to get the best fighters to travel here from Seattle. We are only giving the local Dukes more pretty stuff. The Barony should reconsider the prize structure.

One idea: With the fighting eric tied up with all manner of events, there was not time for fighters to do pick-up fights and wear themselves out. We should set up a couple side erics reserved for pick-up challenges.

Steel Combat

Total 7 C&T and 19 Rapier fighters

Five separate tournaments, they want more. See extra erics above.

Archery

80 participants.

The field was busy for two solid days.

Egils is essentially a regional archery event, we should build on that

Two competitions, including Summits Hunter

237 attendees (total number of seats occupied, not individuals)

52 classes/demos/geek sessions

Egils is major regional A&S event

Heavy weapons fighters have complained that they are not the focus of attention at Egils any more. With so much for non-fighters to do, people weren't spending the entire day watching fighters.

Problems/emergencies:

 On Saturday someone in Vsc. Durin's camp experienced a seizure. This was a known pre-existing problem. Paramedics were called, and the individual was taken to hospital for observation. Note: The path for direct access to the camp was narrow, not sufficient for ambulance access. In future need to ensure that all camps have road access for emergency vehicles.

- Saturday evening there was a domestic disturbance between a couple in a camping van. The man appeared to be intoxicated, and was verbally abusive. He drove out of the park after our people (primarily Wes Worley) intervened. The local police were called and given the van's license plate number. The van did return in the morning, but there was no further incident.
- Our Rapier Marshall in Charge was not properly authorized for the job. The Summits Rapier Marshall took over. Investigation and discussion continues.

New things implemented this year:

Emphasis on accessibility

Wheelchair video posted to Facebook was well received Generator available for recharging chairs and CPAP machines Shuttle to/from parking for mobility impaired Reserved RV spaces for mobility impaired New stairways from meadow to water truck & biffies

Friends of the Park agreement with OPRD

Gives us official standing in decisions made for the park We can do park maintenance at any time, hours go to rebate I have a key to the gate.

- PayPal accepted at Gate.
- Recycling cans and bottles:

Collected \$235, money goes to Egils event income.

Collection and sorting of recyclables was very clean and easy. The was a minute amount of trash in the recyclables, and nothing slimy. A few liquor & wine bottles which were recycled also.

Car window stickers for identification in parking

Helped to identify owners of several improperly parked cars. A good addition, and worth improving in the future.

- We now have a dedicated website for Egils Tourney.
 It was functional this year, and will be improved over time
- Expanded Social Media coverage for advertising and information

Things to improve:

- Set-up and take-down are exhausting, and wearing out our labor force. We need to do some serious rethinking.
- The entrance to the path from parking to the camp is hard to find in daylight, nearly impossible to find at night. This resulted in a lot of demand for shuttle

service from people not mobility-impaired. The entrance, and the path itself, need better marking.

- We need schedules posted around the various venues.
- Big Green is mostly wasted space. We should use half of it to house lists and heralds for the fighting field.
- The area around the eric is very bare. We should encourage individuals and Branches to pitch their (period) pavilions eric-side. With lots of banners.
- Need better traffic control at gate, particularly on Friday.
- We should return to the tradition that next year's event stewards must have been deeply involved in the current year's event, either as area leads or as assistant stewards. Changing leadership every year has the consequence that every year we re-create everything from scratch. This is very inefficient, and makes the event much tougher on everyone. We need to establish continuity in the event leadership.

Area Leader reports were collected and are being used to compile more suggestions for improvements. A debrief meeting was held June 19, the meeting minutes are attached as Addendum 3

Thank you from Hrodnavar to all the staff. Lots of positive comments about the event from all sorts of people. Aim is to figure out how to make the event better, smoother, cheaper. We've done this 18 times on the same site – let's streamline it.

Brynjarr: The Crown and Coronet were very pleased with how it ran and all the staff's work, especially our attention to mobility adaptations.

Discussion focused on Set up

Emma: we can do better on accessibility. We could also add an AA meeting as we had in 1991. Fingall suggested contacting Aaron Brandston & Dierdre, Mark & Dea Potter who could be resources about AA at an event.

Helen: suggested having core group unload and deploy the various pavilions during the day Wed. or Thurs., then have a larger number of folks show up and actually set the pavilions up from 5-8 pm. Big Green doesn't need to go up until Friday when there are lots of people available to do the holding up. (William Cristofore noted that it's important to tighten the top of Big Green on its frame, especially in wet weather).

Aila'ntha emphasized the need to have everything pre-bundled in storage, color coded so that the pieces can be re-assembled if they become separated, with a list of everything that belongs to each pavilion stored with it.

Murchadh: Suggestion that we replace the 5 gallon buckets with army ammo cans for stakes – one per pavilion – and put the ropes in the tub with the pavilion. (Available at military surplus stores or CostCo) Not all pavilions have tubs – larger panthers are folded and tied with ropes/stakes in a stuff bag or bucket.

Have the marshal-in-charge be in charge of setting up the stakes and ropes for the list fields once they are marked out

John Wayland & Alan: Have a pre-made measuring rope in 30/40/50 foot marked lengths so that we can easily lay out the 30' list fields with 90° corners. Archery is making one for laying out the various range lengths.

Archery is redoing the trailer to house all of the archery & thrown weapon gear, including their pavilions.

We will ask Parks to mow the event site on Tuesday, parking on Wed. so that we can set up more easily.

Jacob made drone photos of the event in progress so that we have a record of where things were and can approximate measurements for locations of list fields, BNig Green, A&S area, emergency access road, etc.

Emergency access road was too narrow this year.

Discussion focused on Parking

Make **parking field** markings that are visible at night – glow in the dark paint? Caution/reflective tape on stakes?

Parking helpers wear hi-vis vests.

Work with Parks on moving logs to give having adequate space for both entry and exit areas. Make signs for entrance, exit, exit only (visible to those arriving), 5 mph no dust please x2, path to site x2 (hi vis)

Lights for path between site and parking. Clear signs at forks in the path

Emma will research prices on solar light strings; Godwynn found reflect tapes on Amazon If dry weather, ask Pyks to water the road against dust

Note: put into publicity to bring flashlights for walk between parking and site.

Parking passes – 4 separate colors for 1) parking in handicapped lot, 2) campers, 3&4) different color Sat. & Sun for day trippers,. Ask /help people to write legibly on the pass for use in case of emergency. Tape the pass to the inside of the driver's side windshield. Make parking pass a separate station at gate, after payment and before Lands.

Gate area & handicapped parking -- Use cones or saw horses IN reserved parking spaces for autocrats, as well as signs on them. Paint lines on ground for reserved space.

Have a team of traffic managers/porters line up cars waiting to access sign-in. Work out how to do that working around the dumpster (new position buys us more handicapped parking spaces but disrupts the stacking pattern Ceridwen has used in the past).

Egil's Tourney 47 Debrief (continued)

Gravel lot: Paint lines on gravel for handicapped parking spaces. Have large signs saying reserved handicapped/alter abled parking with permit only in gravel lot (on tripod signboard right at entrance to gravel area?) Emma will research recommended ratios for handicapped parking.

Steel fighting – Bohemund will get certified as a senior steel marshal, willing to run steel next year. Wants to increase steel activities. Suggested working with Thrown Weapons to make 16th century style arguebus rubber band guns.

Asgerdr: Use empty fields late in double-elim. tourneys or a 5th list field for pick up fights for fighters. Steel fighters use them during heavy tourneys and vice versa so that fighters can play more.

Make large print copies spotted around site on sign boards – make tripod sign boards. Kat volunteered to help with formatting or paper schedules.

Large sign for parking lot: -- on a tripod signboard?

THIS LOT HANDICAPPED / ALTER ABLED PARKING WITH PERMIT ONLY

THIS AREA LOAD/UNLOAD ONLY AT ALL TIMES x2 at foot of stairs by gate

Add "wrong way" to DO NOT ENTER signs

For parking lot: ENTRANCE →

EXIT ONLY (visible to those arriving) EXIT (visible to those exiting parking)

5 mph PLEASE NO DUST x 2 for parking road

PATH TO SITE x 2, large, hi vis ← PARKING SITE→ at fork(s?) in path x 2

Get more 24" sign wires at BRING (Yseult will do)

Make 30/40/50 foot measuring ropes for laying out the list fields – different color for each length.

Could make Big Green cotter pins (confirm with him that he's the one to do it)
